

WHAT WE HAVE PLANNED

We have secured the Higgins hotel which is located across the street from the **National WWII Museum**. What better place to celebrate the 80th anniversary of the Commissioning of the USS Boston CA-69.

You will find these answers as well as other facts about WWII at the Higgins Hotel.

You will find this to be a very unique hotel. Every corner has been dedicated to someone, something or someplace during WWII. It is a museum in and of itself.

Thursday Night: Our welcome event will include dinner and entertainment .

Friday you will have the opportunity to tour the **National WWII Museum** located across from the hotel. You don't have to meet a bus you just go to the museum on your own when you are ready. Please be aware it takes 5-6 hours to tour the entire museum.

Your Museum ticket also is your movie ticket to the **2:00 PM** showing of **"Beyond All Borders"**, narrated by Tom Hanks.

Your museum pass also entitles you to purchase a second day pass for \$7.00 that is good to use within 7 days of the purchase. Please note you must purchase this second day pass on your own.

The museum has been 20 years in the making. The final pavilion was completed in July of 2022.

Friday Supper will be a casual supper prior to our Auction & Raffle.

Saturday's Tour: Hop On Hop Off is a tour of New Orleans. The bus stops at the corner of Magazine and Andrew Higgins Street just across from the hotel (stop #10). The first bus pick up begins at **9:25AM**. There are 19 stops so plan your day accordingly. It is a 90 minute loop. You can stay on for the full 90 minutes or you can get off at any of the stops. Just return to where you got off to catch any **Hop On Hop Off** to get back to next stop or ride back to the hotel Stop #10.

Please remember to be back to stop #10 by 5:00 PM. The **Hop On, Hop Off** stops at 5:30 PM, if you are at any stop other than stop #10 at 5:30 PM, you will have to find your own way to get back to the hotel.

Saturday Dinner: Our annual cocktail hour, banquet, entertainment and dancing.

Sunday: we have booked a Jazz Brunch Cruise. What better way to end our weekend then on the Mississippi with great food and music. Gray line busses will shuttle you from the hotel to the **Creole Queen**.

Our memorial service will take place aboard the **Creole Queen**.
