

GLENN MORGAN STEWART

On September 22, 2011, Glenn "Stew" Morgan Stewart, Jr. passed away in Arlington, VA. Glenn was born in Monongah, WV on November 22, 1921 to Glenn and Clara Stewart. Stew enrolled at Fairmont State College in 1939 where he met his future wife, Rosalie Merrifield. After an extended friendship, Rosalie and Glenn were married in Fairmont, WV on June 13, 1943. In 1940, Glenn received his appointment to the Naval Academy. In 1943, in the midst of [WWII](#), Stew embarked on the [USS Boston for the Pacific](#). After serving in the [Korean War](#), he retired in 1954 as a Lieutenant. With Rosalie and four young children, Ryan, Scott, Fran, and Glenn, Stew moved to Falls Church, VA, where he took a position as an Electrical Engineer at Melpar. He also worked at Scope and the Department of the Army, where he retired. In addition to debating politics and religion with his wife, Glenn enjoyed golf, bowling, and table tennis. He was also a master at Minesweeper with a record time that never ceased to amaze grandchildren. Along with his four children, Glenn leaves 10 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, Finn and Zivia Davis of Seattle, WA. After a chapel service on May 18, Glenn's ashes will be inurned next to his wife at Arlington National Cemetery. A reception follows at The Jefferson in Arlington, VA at 3 p.m.
