Donald Andrew Stillwagon, 79, formerly of Cumberland, died June 13, 2020 at Potomac Valley Nursing Home, Rockville, MD. Born June 19, 1940 in Cumberland, he was the son of the late John D. Stillwagon and Faye A. (Tofani) Stillwagon.
